DANIEL K.N. JOHNSON is the Gerald L. Schlessman Professor of Economics, Associate Chair the Economics and Business Department, and Director of the Innovative Minds Program at Colorado College. He has a PhD from Yale (1998), an MSc from the London School of Economics (1992) and a BSocSci Honors from the University of Ottawa, Canada (1991). He is the author of over forty commissioned pieces, book chapters and refereed journal articles. Specializing in the economics of innovation and technological change, he frequently advises and lectures internationally on public policy related to intellectual property rights. In addition to his primary research on knowledge spillovers, he enjoys writing projects that apply economic models to unusual questions: predicting Olympic medal counts, explaining game show contestant behavior, evaluating the impact of WalMart on residential property values, explaining the adoption of new election equipment in the wake of vote count scandals, analyzing where consumers can find the cheapest gas, and evaluating pedagogical techniques and outcomes in economics.
