### ABOUT THE AUTHOR

Robert D. Loevy was born in St. Louis, Missouri, on February 26, 1935. He received his A.B. from Williams College in 1957 and his Ph.D. from Johns Hopkins University in 1963.

While at Johns Hopkins, he conducted research and wrote position papers for the U.S. House of Representatives Republican Policy Committee. During the 1963-1964 academic year, he served as an American Political Science Association Congressional Fellow in the office of United States Senator Thomas H. Kuchel, of California. Senator Kuchel was the Republican floor manager in the Senate for the civil rights bill that later became the Civil Rights Act of 1964.

In 1968, Loevy joined the faculty at Colorado College in Colorado Springs, Colorado, where he served as professor of Political Science for 43 years. His major research interests included Congress and civil rights, presidential elections, and Colorado politics and government.

He was the author of *To End All Segregation: The Politics of the Passage of the Civil Rights Act of 1964*, and he was the editor of *The Civil Rights Act of 1964: The Passage of the Law that Ended Racial Segregation.* He wrote a memoir of his experiences working as a Senate staff member on the Civil Rights Act of 1964 entitled *On the Forward Edge: American Government and the Civil Rights Act of 1964*.

He also wrote *The Flawed Path to the Presidency 1992: Unfairness and Inequality in the Presidential Selection Process*, as well as *The Manipulated Path to the White House 1996: Maximizing Advantage in the Presidential Selection Process*.

His Colorado publications included *The Flawed Path to the Gover-norship 1994: The Nationalization of a Colorado Statewide Election*, and, with Thomas Cronin, *Colorado Politics and Policy: Governing a Purple State*.

He also was the co-author of a high school civics text, *American Government: We Are One*.

In celebration of the 125<sup>th</sup> anniversary of the founding of Colorado College, Loevy wrote *Colorado College: A Place of Learning, 1874-1999*. This book, *Colorado College: 1999-2012*, is a continuation of that work.
